CATching Stones - Artwork in Progress by Margaret Shaw

With the sale of stones leading up to the Christmas period, it was time to design some new ones. 4 Stones were selected and prepared with clear gesso.



Next outline silhouettes were prepared to fit the size of the stones. Then drawn onto the surface and a background worked to fit around. The brown stone (top left) was to be left its natural colour. The patterned stone (top right) also left natural but with its marble light areas outlined. Bottom left stone had some interesting patterns, so planned to emphasise these. Bottom right had a dark but shiny surface so may be left as a natural background providing the black cat stands out.



Painted in the cat silhouettes with a very fine brush to ensure the points on the ears. As some of these stones were planned to be left with natural backgrounds, the outlines needed to be precise. I did feel at this point that the bottom right cat stood out against the grey stone.



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Here they are finished. I had a change of mind with the landscape cat as I decided to paint the background. One I drew along the pattern outline on the stone it reminded me of a celtic pattern. I followed the pattern with with white thorough shades of blue to a dark Prussian blue, then outlined.
